# A BILL

To apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund the sum of Four hundred and ninety-one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two pounds to the service of the period ending thirtieth day of June One thousand the nine hundred and one.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty and the Preamble. Senate and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia as follows :-----

1. There shall and may be issued and applied for or towards Issue and 5 making good the supply granted to His Majesty for the service of the period ending the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and one the sum of Four hundred and ninety-one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two pounds out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund, for the purposes and services expressed in the Schedule to 10 this Act, and the Treasurer is hereby authorized and empowered to issue and apply the moneys authorized to be issued and applied.

2. The said sum shall be available to satisfy the warrants under Sum available for the hand of the Governor-General in respect of any purposes and the purposes set forth in Schedule. services set forth in the said Schedule.

15 **3**. No moneys shall be expended under the authority of this Act after the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and one.

# A BILL

To apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund the sum of Four hundred and ninety-one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two pounds to the service of the period ending the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and one.

FOR the purpose of appropriating the grant made by the House Preamble, of Representatives: Be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty and the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia as follows :---

1. There shall and may be issued and applied for or towards Issue and 5 making good the supply granted to His Majesty for the service of the period ending the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and one the sum of Four hundred and ninety-one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two pounds out of the Consolidated Revenue 10 Fund, for the purposes and services expressed in the Schedule to this Act, and the Treasurer is hereby authorized and empowered to issue and apply the moneys authorized to be issued and applied.

2. The said sum shall be available to satisfy the warrants under Sum available for the hand of the Governor-General in respect of any purposes and 15 services set forth in the said Schedule.


