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This Act may be cited as the Horse Disease Response Levy (Consequential Amendments) Act 2011.

15	(1) The Commonwealth is to make a payment (the <i>Commonwealth</i>
16	<i>payment</i> ) to the Australian Animal Health Council of an amount

26	Condition on Commonwealth payment
27	(2) The Commonwealth payment is subject to the condition that the
28	Australian Animal Health Council apply the payment in
29	accordance with this section.

1	First priority for applying Commonwealth payment
2	(3) As first priority, the Australian Animal Health Council is to apply
3	the Commonwealth payment in meeting, or reimbursing the
4	Council for meeting, costs the Council incurs:
5	(a) in receiving and applying the payment in accordance with
6	this section; and
7	(b) before or in the financial year in which the payment is made.
8	Second priority for applying Commonwealth payment
9	(4) As second priority, the Australian Animal Health Council is to
10	apply the Commonwealth payment in making to the
11	Commonwealth a payment (the <i>Council payment</i> ) as follows,
12	depending on whether, when the Commonwealth payment was
13	made, a non-government body concerned with the horse industry
14	was party to the EADR agreement:
15	(a) if such a body was party to the agreement—the Council
16	payment is on behalf of the body for the purpose of discharging a lightlity of the body to the Commonwealth that
17	discharging a liability of the body to the Commonwealth that arises under the EADR agreement;

19 20	(b) if there was not such a body party to the agreement—the Council payment is made within 28 days after the
20 21	Commonwealth payment was made and equals so much of
22	the payment to the Council as the Council has not applied
23	under subsection (3).
24	Third priority for applying Commonwealth payment
25	(5) As third priority, the Australian Animal Health Council is to apply
26	the Commonwealth payment in:
27	(a) making a payment to an organisation that is concerned with
28	research and development relevant to the horse industry; or
29	(b) taking measures relating to the promotion or maintenance of
30	the health of horses.
31	(6) The Australian Animal Health Council is to apply the
32	Commonwealth payment under subsection (5) only:
33	(a) on request by a non-government body that is a party to the
34	EADR agreement and is concerned with the horse industry;
35	and
36	(b) in the way that that body requests.

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1		Applying for lower priority if higher priority cannot be met
2		(7) The Australian Animal Health Council may apply the
3		Commonwealth payment in accordance with a lower priority if the
4		Council cannot apply the payment in accordance with a higher
5		priority. For this purpose, a priority set out in a later subsection is
6		lower than a priority set out in an earlier subsection.
7		Setting off Council payment to Commonwealth
8 9 10		(8) The Commonwealth may set off an amount payable to it under paragraph (4)(b) against a payment the Commonwealth must make under subsection (1).

19		(a) a person pays an amount of horse disease response levy or of
20 21		penalty for failure to pay horse disease response levy by the time it became due for payment; and

1	Liability of Council to repay overpayment
2	(3) Each payment under subsection $4A(1)$ that exceeds the amount it
3 4	should have been because of subsection (2) of this section is subject to the condition that:
5 6	(a) the excess is a debt due by the Australian Animal Health Council to the Commonwealth; and
7	(b) the Australian Animal Health Council comply with
8	subsection (5) of this section (if applicable).
9	Note: Some or all of this debt may be discharged if the Commonwealth
10	expects it will not be able to set this debt off against future payments
11 12	under subsection $4A(1)$ , and if past payments under that subsection have already been applied. See subsections (5) and (6) of this section.

14	(4) The Commonwealth may set off the excess against an amount that
