HIS Excellency the Governor-General desires it to be notified for general information that, in 1930, His late Majesty King George V. was pleased to approve of a special flag for use by the Governor-General in each Dominion. His Excellency has received advice of the Commonwealth Government's approval to the adoption of this special flag as the flag of the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, thus making for uniformity of custom throughout His Majesty's Dominions.

The description of the flag of the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia is as follows:—

The flag, of which the length is twice the breadth at the head, consists of a Royal blue ground, on which is

the Royal Crest in gold with the words "Commonwealth of Australia" in blue letters on a gold scroll below the Crest.

A design of the flag is subjoined.

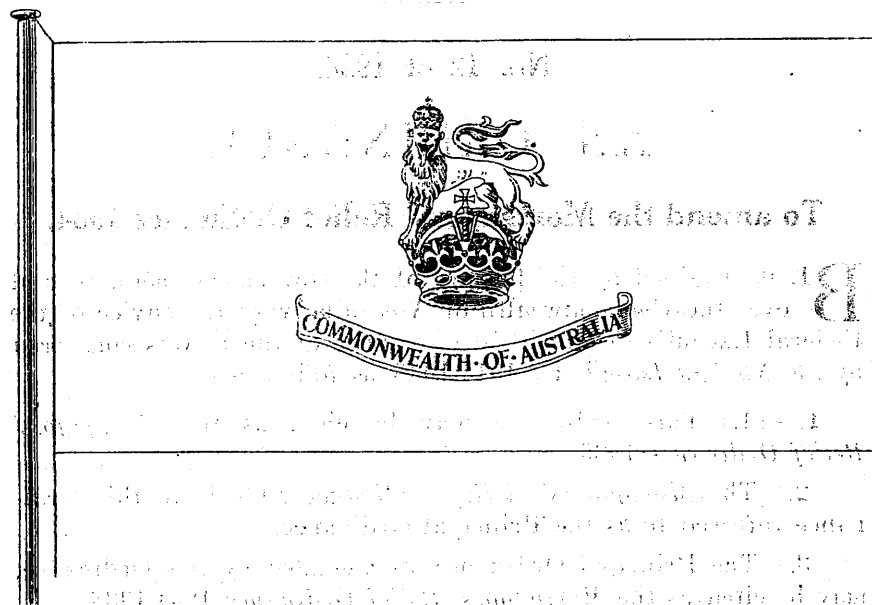

No. 28 of 1936.

AN ORDINANCE

To amend the *Juvenile Offenders (Detention) Ordinance 1935*.

BE it ordained by the Deputy of the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909* and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1933*, as follows:—

Short title and citation.

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Juvenile Offenders (Detention) Ordinance 1936*.

(2.) The *Juvenile Offenders (Detention) Ordinance 1935* is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Juvenile Offenders (Detention) Ordinance 1936*.

2. After section five of the Principal Ordinance the following section is inserted:—

Interpretation.

“5A. Section five of the Act is amended by adding at the end of the definition of ‘Child’ the words ‘and, in the provisions relating to institutions and the committal of children to institutions, means boy or girl under eighteen years of age.’”

AN ORDINANCE

To amend the *Mortgagors' Relief Ordinance 1934*.

BE it ordained by the Deputy of the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Norfolk Island Act 1913-1935*, as follows:—

Short title and citation.

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Mortgagors' Relief Ordinance 1936*.

(2.) The *Mortgagors' Relief Ordinance 1934* is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Mortgagors' Relief Ordinance 1934-1936*.

2. Section two of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting the word "two" and inserting in its stead the word "three".

As a muster on behalf of the Crown has not been made, no guarantee and/or warranty is given as to the number of live-stock, horses, and cattle depasturing on the land; but observers of a recent muster made in pursuance and in fulfilment of an agreement between the late holder of the property and his working partner to secure to the latter 1,000 head, estimate the number to be 2,000 more or less. The declared stock return as at 31st December, 1934, by the late holder stated that 4,600 head were then depasturing on the land.

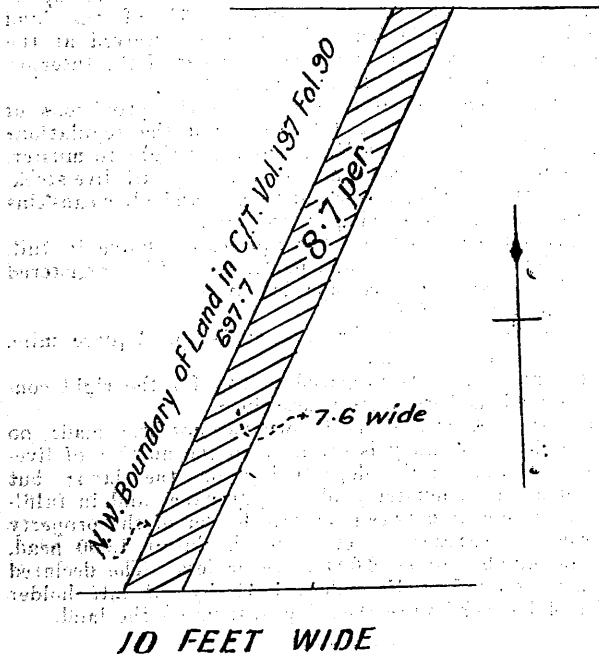

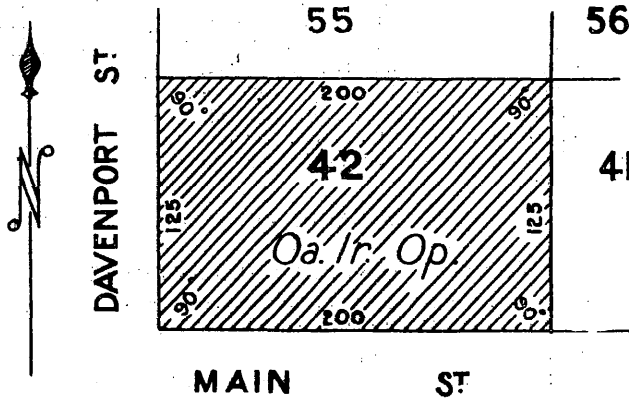

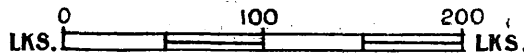
